


WESTON'S FARM

Cut-Your-Own Christmas Trees

2018



The fields are open the day after Thanksgiving with trees up to 9' tall. Trees over 8' will go quickly. There will be a decreasing selection of the remaining trees as Christmas approaches.

The CYO trees are located in a scenic field 1/8 mile from the farm market in Fryeburg. You will need to drive to the field **after** you check in at the farm. The road is well maintained, but a truck is always easiest. We will provide you with a bow saw and twine to get your tree out of the field. There are no employees in the field to assist you, so be prepared to cut and load the tree yourself.

After you cut your tree, bring it back to the farm to pay for it (there will be additional sales tax). If you would like the tree wrapped for transport, that is done at the farm for an additional cost of \$1.00 per tree. We can also help secure your tree on your vehicle on the weekends. Please check in at the farm before going to the field.

Balsam Fir Pricing:

Trees are progressively priced according to height and quality. Colored flagging at the tip of the tree designates price. If there are 2 different tags on the tree the price is the higher one. The other tag is last years.

Untagged Trees = \$36.00

Red Tags = \$45.00

Blue Tags = \$55.00

White Tags = \$65.00

2018 SPECIFIC INFORMATION:

The hillside behind the market is out of trees for now. Please be prepared to drive to the lower field for a tree.

We are out of Fraser Firs for the next several years due to a break in the planting schedule. We have planted more, but they are still young.

Last January we had another flood in the tree fields (in addition to the flood in late October). The January flood was followed by extreme cold which formed thick ice around the trees and caused damage to the lower sections of some trees. You will notice where some trees have had many lower limbs removed due to this damage. You may also see an occasional dead branch within the tree due to the ice. We have priced the trees accordingly.

We have an early winter. The main road to the trees will be plowed and maintained, but please be aware that there will still be snow in and around the trees when walking and cutting a tree.

Depending on weather and supply we may close the fields for the year after the second week in December.



Frequently Asked Questions:

Can I let my dog out in the field? Unfortunately no. Even dogs on a leash can cause unwanted issues (like errant messes that are not nice to lie in while cutting a tree).

Can I save a tree to cut at a later date? Unfortunately no. The simple truth is we have found that some customers will not respect the saved tree and cut it anyway.

Can I bring my own saw? Yes

Can I walk to the trees? Technically yes, but it is not encouraged. It is a long walk back while lugging a tree.

Why do the trees have dead needles on the inside? As the trees grow and become more dense, light is cut off to the interior parts of the tree and the needles die. This happens to all pruned trees. After you cut the tree, shake out the dead needles – the green ones will remain.

How many trees do you grow? We grow and maintain over 5,000 trees.

How old are the trees? A 7' tree is approximately 13 years old.

Do you sell dug trees that can be replanted? We do not. Check with a nursery company in your area.

Do you use pesticides on your trees? No. There are no sprays on the trees or ground under the trees.
